

Vid Bobnar obtained his PhD from the University of Ljubljana, Slovenia, in y. 2000, with the thesis title »Phase transitions in relaxor ferroelectrics: dielectric spectroscopy studies.« After postdoctoral research at the University of Augsburg, Germany, he returned to Slovenia and currently works as scientific councilor in the Dielectric Spectroscopy Laboratory of the Condensed Matter Physics Department at the Jožef Stefan Institute, Ljubljana. He is also full professor at the Jožef Stefan International Postgraduate School. His main professional interests are experimental solid state physics, physics of disordered or partially ordered systems, and materials research and design. He was/is the principal investigator of several national research projects, joint projects with foreign institutions, and has established a long-lasting collaboration with the Pennsylvania State University. He was visiting lecturer at the University of Oulu, Finland, and visiting scientist at the Korea Basic Science Institute, Daejeon. He is currently leading the research within the national research project »Advanced inorganic and organic thin films with enhanced electrically-induced response«, with the main emphasis on development of composite thin-film materials with enhanced dielectric and, particularly, electromechanical response.
